Family in Need

The Davidson-Talley family is in need of assistance. Valerie is 19 weeks pregnant and has been out of work because of the extreme nature of her pregnancy sickness. This means that her pay has been cut. Dylan's teaching job was cut to part-time this year, so their income was already lower than usual. By continuing and intensifying their frugal habits, they have been able to get by, but the expected child adds significantly to their cost of living. They are planning to move back to Albuquerque in October, where the living is cheaper and both their families live, but that also entails its own expenses. Valerie and Dylan are asking for any assistance you can share, and can provide itemized reports of income and expenses between April and October 2018. *Under this scenario, the couple live with a family with extra space, or in a property lent to them rent-free, which would reduce their current expenses by almost 40%.

Building Committee Update

The parish building committee has worked very hard these past few months to analyze, discuss and advise on a future property. We have had the church properties appraised by a realtor (appraised at about 1.1 million for both the church and rectory), analyzed the parish financial situation (posted quarterly on the bulletin board along with the advisory board minutes), discussed our vision with the Eparchy, been on the lookout for potential properties, and prayed about the next move. We want to be ready to move on a property that the parish discerns would meet our needs, so the next steps are:

- Open a Bishop-approved "Building Fund" that will allow us to raise (church tax exempt) funds specifically for a new property.
- Look into fundraising opportunities.
- Continued development and parish conversation about what exactly we are looking for in a new property.

From Perla: Help for an Old Parishioner

Dear Parishioners,
Our old friend Shalimar Masters reached out for help. Financial help, she is very humbled/embarrassed having to ask for money. Shalimar & baby are doing well (Shalimar had preeclampsia after delivering baby) but Corey was laid off in February. They currently have \$45 dollars to their name, they are desperately asking for help.
Here's what she wrote me and has given me permission to share.

"I hate asking for money. Corey had an interview on Monday when baby and I were still in the hospital, but he turned it down to stay with us, and lost the potential for the job. I don't know how much I would even ask for from our community.

Although there are the other bills like phones and electricity and whatnot, those are smaller and I was able to make our van payment last month. The thing that has me stressing is the mortgage, which is \$1002 per month, and the insurance for the van and the house is \$277 which comes due on the 15th. The mortgage was due on the first, but we have til the 10th to pay it with no penalties. I figure with credit cards and whatever else, those can go unpaid and even if it does bad things to credit, it's not actual shelter. It's the mortgage that stresses me out. I figure if ten people have \$100 or 100 people have \$10, we could cover it."
