Philip's Fast

Our Byzantine Catholic Church observes four periods of penance and fasting throughout the church year. One of those four, a 40 day preparation for the feast of the Nativity of Our Lord (Christmas), begins the day after the feast of the Holy Apostle Philip, and is thus called the "Philip's Fast". It begins this coming Thursday, and ends at Midnight on Christmas morning. Bishop John has made this fast optional, but traditionally, Byzantine Catholics would abstain from meat, dairy, alcohol and oil/fried foods on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, and abstain from meat and dairy on Tuesdays and Thursdays. This fast would intensify from December 10th through the 24th. Again, this fast is completely optional, but please do intensify your prayer, fasting and almsgiving in preparation for the glorious feast of Our Lord's Nativity. Blessed Fast!
