Holy Mysteries

All requesting Holy Mysteries must be parishioners for at least six months.

Holy Baptism: Requires Pre-Jordan; Baptisms are conducted within a Divine Liturgy. At least one God-parent must be Catholic by faith and the other a practicing Christian. Both God-parents must be in good standing with their parish.

Mystery of Crowning: Requires Pre-Cana; Consult the parish priest at least six months before making wedding plans. Marriages cannot be celebrated during the Fasting Seasons of the Church.

Church Funerals: Provided for practicing parishioners who are current in their spiritual and financial obligations to the parish; otherwise burial is from the funeral home.

Sick Calls/Anointing/Hospital Visits: Requested by the parishioner or family. Anointing prior to surgery/hospitalization or after Sunday Divine Liturgy. Contact Father for anointing. We understand the need for privacy so initiate the contact if hospitalized or when moved to a different care location.

The church is available for private prayer upon request. Please e-mail Fr. Brian.

Beginning Saturday Services

The Peter and Paul (Apostles) Fast

The Apostles Fast continues through June 28th. The Typikon prescribes strict abstinence on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, with mitigated abstinence (Wine and Oil) on Tuesday and Thursday.

The Ruthenian Metropolia has identified this period as a penitential season (Canon 880, 2). This fast is typically observed by the faithful with Wednesday and Friday abstinence in our Eparchy.

Building Fund

Envelopes are available to contribute to Holy Protection's Building Fund! On the back of the envelope write your envelope number. A monthly contribution on the first Sunday of the month helps us achieve the funding for our new church.

Return to Public Liturgies

The guidelines for return to publicly attended Liturgies is posted in the narthex. Among the key points are 1) masks to be worn, 2) closing of hall and restrooms, 3) no use of the teal Divine Liturgy books; the faithful are encouraged to bring their own from home, 4) no kissing of the icon on the tetrapod; venerate the icon by bowing and crossing yourself in the Byzantine manner, 5) the offertory basket is at the foot of the tetrapod.

We can remember our living loved ones on their birthdays, baptism anniversaries, wedding anniversaries, health needs and indeed any other intention.

For our deceased family and friends, we should remember them on the anniversaries of their death as well as any other time we wish. Offertory stipends are traditionally given to the priest for these services but no one is ever denied a Divine Liturgy intention based on a stipend.

To pray for one another is a direct teaching of Our Lord and His holy church. "Pray for those who love us and pray for those who hate us". See Fr. Brian for any scheduling of Divine Liturgy intentions.

With the beginning of Saturday Divine Liturgies, all Saturdays are open for intentions.
